- Have your own access to a computer and printer.
- Have an email account that you check frequently.
- In-person interview and writing sample.
- Director's approval based on application.

Course Expectations

- You must be able to attend all classes from 9:00am-3:00pm
- There will be pre-reading assignments before the course begins.
- You are expected to have strong family support and have childcare planned if necessary. S-TESL cannot accommodate children in the building when you are a student.
